Imperative for change

With market consolidation, decreasing patient volumes and reimbursement cuts, health care organizations must take a targeted service line approach to determine how they will differentiate and achieve smart growth in their market. Through their Market Performance Partnership and Advisory Board membership, Boulder Community Health (BCH) conducted a structured and focused service line assessment to identify their biggest opportunities for growth resulting in the development of a 3-year strategic plan. Following these efforts, cardiology was identified as the first service line for targeted transformation. BCH partnered with Optum Advisory to set and implement a cardiology service line strategy to remain an independent, sustainable health system and support the evolving care needs of its community.

Impact


In collaboration with Optum partners, Boulder Community Health transformed its cardiology service line to achieve smart growth and drive sustainable change across the enterprise. Key successes include:

 Improved quality scores across coronary artery bypass graft, percutaneous coronary intervention and electrophysiology to allow the organization to publicly report data and market excellent outcomes to their community

- 50% increase in physician new patient visits drive access to care and additional revenue capture
- 15% increase in echo testing to enable timely access to interventions, improving outcomes and patient satisfaction
- Optimized cath lab schedule to drive 24% increase in volume, improving timely access to procedural care, lowering unnecessary workforce costs and strengthening patient and staff experience.
